Private Tutoring Policies

We offer individual tutoring year-round, in addition to the workshops. We encourage students to bring in a previous ACT that they have taken to review.

English/Reading:

The basic prep consists of 4 hours per subject. We usually work in 2-hour sessions, but we sometimes divide the grammar session into 2 one-hour sessions because it's so tedious. We do more one-hour sessions for students who live close by. We often continue with more tutoring after the first four hours, but we strongly recommend *at least* 4 hours to cover the basic tutorial for each subject. After the first 4 hours, we will work on more specific skills, and we will do practice tests together – it will just depend on what you want and what your student's needs are.

Kelly Walden is our English/reading teacher. Kelly has been teaching ACT prep since 2005. She tutors from her house at 2937 Clark St., Paducah, KY 42001.

Math/Science:

We work in 1-hour sessions because we have to work around children's nap schedules. We strongly recommend at least four hours for math prep as well. One of those hours will be specifically centered on TI-84 calculator tips and tricks. Otherwise, we will prep math content and ACT-specific questions related to the content, and work on practice tests together.

Science is suggested in 2 1-hour sessions. Science is more strategy-based than math, so 2 1-hour sessions are all we need to cover the needed material to raise scores.

Kaylin Mannon is our math/science teacher. Kaylin is a certified high school math teacher who is currently a stay-at-home mom. She tutors from her house at 59 Martha Ln., Symsonia, KY 42082.

Rate:

We charge \$75 an hour for Monday-Friday. However, if a parent commits to at least 4 hours for one subject, or the student has taken the workshop, we will discount the price to \$65 an hour to encourage completing that subject. Evenings and weekends are \$100 an hour, but with the discount, \$75 for four hours. We are not often available on weekends, but we will often try to work seniors in.
